

Encounters with Grace!

Today in our Gospel Peter, James and John have an **encounter with grace**. It was an encounter that they would never forget. The best definition I have heard of **grace** is "**the life of God active within us**." The grace of God surrounds us at every moment of every day. If we don't experience it, it is because we are not looking and reflecting how God is working in our lives. But as surely as we breathe our lives are filled with grace events every day. Our very existence is a gift from God. **Lent 2024** will surely be an encounter with grace for you. Our Lord wants to assist us and strengthen us for the journey!

How goes your Lenten journey? This weekend we start week two of the journey. Week six of Lent is Holy Week. I ask some people how their Lent is going and they say, "Father, I think I blew all my commitments in the first week. I ate a whole sleeve of cookies, got angry at the kids or my spouse and have not prayed like I wanted." Well, don't worry because Lent is not like the hundred-yard dash where you only get one shot at victory. It's more like a marathon, where even if we have a bad mile we can persevere and make it up. Has your journey gone thus far? If your commitments were too strict and your feel like quitting reassess and see what the Holy Spirit says to you. If you have made commitments that seem fairly easy consider picking up the pace and going a little harder.

Remember there is the Lent we plan and then there is the Lent that we get. Have you had something unexpected pop up this Lent; perhaps an issue with finances, relationships or health? It is never easy to receive an unexpected Cross but these crosses somehow have a way of sanctifying us and making us closer to Christ.

Remember the basic elements of Lent are **prayer**, **fasting and almsgiving**. Hopefully you have had some experience with each of these in this season. If not, consider adding these to your journey. I hope that the **daily mass readings** are part of your Lenten journey. What a blessing to soak in the Word of God for 40 days and hear the call to conversion. Try to make a good Confession this Lent. Confession is part of our conversion experience.

Let us be encouraged in our Lenten journey to seek **moments of grace** in order to grow closer to Jesus Christ. We are beginning our second week in this season of grace. We have four more weeks to be open to the many gifts God has in store for us. If we've been lackluster let's put it behind us and move forward looking for more moments of grace. God has great plans for our lives. Today we see moments of God's grace in the lives of Abraham, Peter, James and John. Their lives were never the same after these encounters with God. May this Lent be a moment of grace for all of us and our families. May we be open to **moments of grace** that are prepared for us!

<u>FASTING</u> Remember that during all the Fridays of Lent we abstain from meat. Why Fridays? That is the day that Jesus died for us (Good Friday), so our small act of penance helps us think of His saving act throughout the day.

If I give something up for Lent do I have to give it up on Sundays? Every Sunday is the day of Resurrection so we do not have to fast on Sundays. However, some people may wish to go the extra mile to include Sundays as an extra gift. Remember fasting is your sacrifice/offering and you can determine the value of the gift. Did you give up ice cream this Lent? Go ahead and have some on Sundays or feel free to include Sundays for the penance. It is up to you!




