

Nothingness vs. Everything!

There is a **tension** that develops during Lent that I call the "**gift of nothingness**" versus the "**gift of everything.**" Under "nothingness", part of our Lenten journey is to recognize that we are **sinners**. We have all gone astray and chosen sin. As we remember the **sufferings** of Jesus as we pray the **Stations of the Cross, the Sorrowful mysteries** or hear the account of the **Passion**, we recognize the result of our sin. Our sins led to the **suffering and death** of Jesus.

The good news is that Lent is a time of renewal. Despite our sinfulness we are reminded how much we are loved. Even though we were dead in our sins, we are brought to new life by the grace of Christ. We hear those beautiful words of John, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." It was not the will of the Father that we perish so he took an extraordinary step. He sent His only Son into the world to free us. How great is the Father's love for us!

How do we determine the worth of something? We find out how much has been paid for it. There are paintings that cost \$15 and there are paintings that cost 15 million dollars. How much are you worth? What did you cost? The Son of God shed his blood for you and that makes you priceless. You were paid for with the blood of the Lamb! St. Paul says, "We are his handiwork..." Did you hear that? You are the handiwork of God! We are created by the very hands of God.

When you are shopping and the owner says, "That is **handmade**" you know it is very special. Special care and consideration have gone into its creation. Did you ever think that you were handmade by God? How much care and consideration went into making you? Psalm 139 says, "**Truly you have formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb.** I give you thanks that I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

How often do you stop and realize that **God is madly in love with you?** We long to be loved. **God is thinking of us every moment of every day**. God wants the **absolute best** for our lives. Are we aware of that fact? Once we know this, how can we not submit every area of our lives to God?

And yet, at the same time, God's love is extremely personal. St. Augustine says, "God loves each one of us as if there was only one of us to love". That is the good news of Lent. As I pray the Stations of the Cross, as I meditate on the Sorrowful mysteries as I go to mass, I realize my self worth. God sent His only son into the world for me!

Let us enter into the **tension of Lent**. Yes, I have **sinned and wandered from the friendship of God** but God calls to me and wishes to take me back. That is the **center of my self-worth:** God sent His only son into the world to rescue me. That Son says to me today, "**This is my body which will be given up for you**" and I realize how much I am loved.


