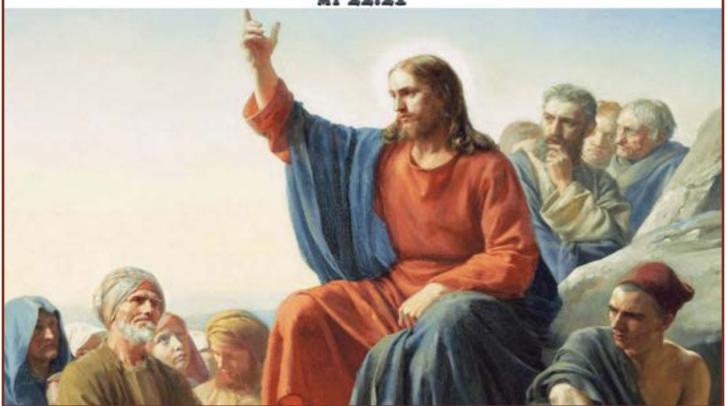

Running Laps!

It can be intimidating to think of Lent as a linear 40-day journey into the desert. The length and challenges of the trip can intimidate us. There is also a temptation to feel that if we've fallen short on our commitments and made mistakes just to stop trying. A helpful technique for the long journey of Lent is to think of it as **a series of laps around the track**. Let me explain.

Those of you who ran track in high school remember doing laps around a track. The traditional tracks were 1/4 of a mile. You knew that if you wanted to run an 8 minute mile then each lap had to be two minutes long. As you came around for each lap your coach would yell out the times and you could assess whether you were on pace, going too fast, or too slow. You could then adjust in your stride to reach the target. This is where we are on the Lenten journey. We have six weeks of lent and we are now beginning week three.

As you look back over the first two weeks of Lent ask yourself a few questions: Was my pace too slow? Have I failed to make challenging commitments? Have I failed to keep the commitments I have made? After some early failures did I feel like throwing in the towel and forgetting about all of my commitments? If this has been your experience of Lent so far then it's time to pick up the pace. It is time to look at your commitments and recommit for the Lenten journey. There are still four weeks to go!

Sometimes in a race, due to the excitement we can go out of the gates **too fast.** Our adrenaline leads us out, but we don't have the stamina to survive the long haul. We can do this with our commitments. We can be very excited about Lent and make too many commitments and now we feel very tired. Perhaps we made commitments that were too strict or have not borne fruit. In this case perhaps we need to **slow down our pace**. With four weeks ahead of us we need to keep a pace that we can sustain to finish the race well.

Where are you at on your Lenten journey? Four weeks from today is Easter Sunday. A good runner will pick up the pace as they spy the finish line. There is grace in your pace! May we adjust are pace properly so that we can run the race well and win the crown!

Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one. (I Cor 9:24-25)
