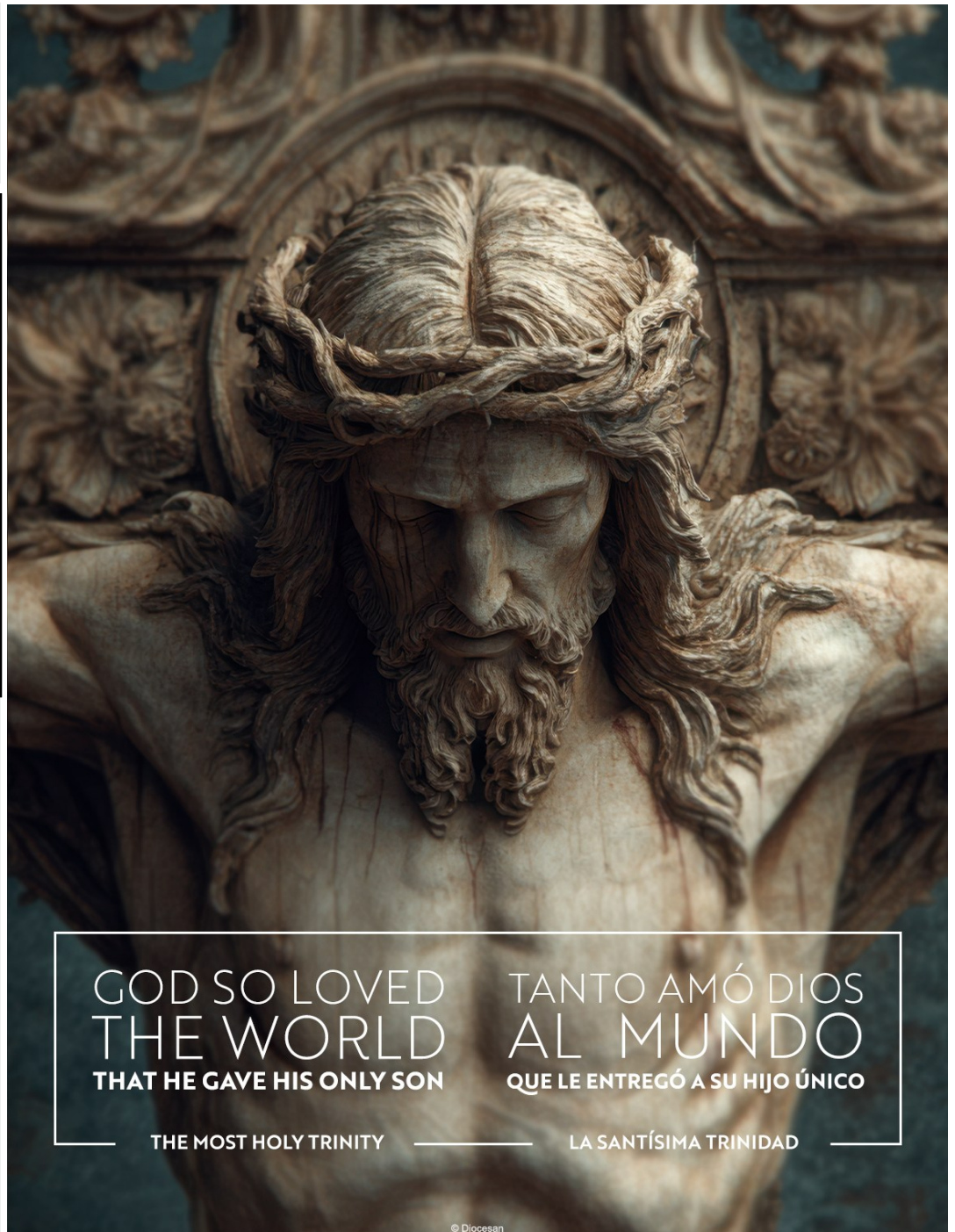

The Sign of the Cross

In my numerous encounters and experiences in protestant circles, I encountered the practice of "sharing the grace," where gatherings would usually end with a recitation of 2 Corinthians 13:13, which is the final statement in our second reading today. This prayer of St. Paul at the end of his second letter to the Corinthians contains obvious Trinitarian language and theology which is appropriate to ponder on for our celebration today.

On this celebration of the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, St. Paul's little intercessory prayer teaches us a few things. Firstly, we are reassured in our belief in the Trinity as a continuation of the ancient Christian faith and teaching which has been passed down to us. As early as the first century, the name of the Trinity was already being invoked in prayer over the faithful. And this is a fundamental aspect of our Catholic faith, showing our continuation of the ancient traditions.

We also do our best to pass on this tradition. One of the first things we are taught as kids or teach to our children is how to make the sign of the Cross, a small gesture and prayer in which the name of the Trinity is invoked over us both in public and private prayer. The invocation of the Trinity in prayer by this simple gesture of the sign of the cross, along with the words "in the name of the Father, Son, and of the Holy Spirit," does so much more than to just open and close out our prayer.

When we invoke the Trinity in this way, we become like Moses in our first reading who says to God, "if I find favor with you, come along in our company." A simple complete sign of the cross does this for us too. We invite the Trinitarian God to be in our company.

Friends, the invocation of the name of the Trinity benefits us for eternal life. And as Catholics, our public witness matters. We must not be ashamed to show the world that we believe in the God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We must not be afraid to make the sign of the cross in public, at eating places, our workplace, schools, and anywhere we find ourselves. It is a great treasure in which is contained so many graces. Today, let us ask for the courage to carry the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit with us wherever we go. And so, I pray with St. Paul: *"May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."* In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

La Señal de la Cruz

En mis numerosos encuentros y experiencias en círculos protestantes, encontré la práctica de "compartir la gracia", donde las reuniones solían terminar con la recitación de 2 Corintios 13:13, que es la última afirmación en nuestra segunda lectura de hoy. Esta oración de San Pablo al final de su segunda carta a los Corintios contiene un lenguaje y teología trinitarios evidentes que es apropiado para reflexionar en nuestra celebración de hoy.

En esta celebración de la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, la pequeña oración de intercesión de San Pablo nos enseña algunas cosas. En primer lugar, nos reconforta nuestra creencia en la Trinidad como continuación de la antigua fe y enseñanza cristiana que nos ha sido transmitida.

Ya en el siglo I, el nombre de la Trinidad se invocaba en oración sobre los fieles. Y este es un aspecto fundamental de nuestra fe católica, mostrando la continuación de las antiguas tradiciones.

También hacemos todo lo posible por transmitir esta tradición.

Una de las primeras cosas que nos enseñan de niños o enseñamos a nuestros hijos es cómo hacer la señal de la Cruz, un pequeño gesto y oración en el que se invoca el nombre de la

Trinidad sobre nosotros tanto en la oración pública como en la privada. La invocación de la Trinidad en oración con este simple gesto de la señal de la cruz, junto con las palabras "en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo", hace mucho más que simplemente abrir y cerrar nuestra oración.

Cuando invocamos la Trinidad de esta manera, nos volvemos como Moisés en nuestra primera lectura, que dice a Dios: "si te gana favor, ven en nuestra compañía." Una simple señal completa de la cruz también hace esto por nosotros. Invitamos al Dios trinitario a estar en nuestra compañía.

Amigos, la invocación del nombre de la Trinidad nos beneficia para la vida eterna.

Y como católicos, nuestro testimonio público importa.

No debemos avergonzarnos de mostrar al mundo que creemos en el Dios, que es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo.

No debemos tener miedo de hacer la señal de

la cruz en público, en los restaurantes, en nuestro lugar de trabajo, en las escuelas y en cualquier lugar donde nos encontremos. Es un gran tesoro en el que se guardan tantas gracias. Hoy, pidamos el valor de llevar con nosotros el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu

Santo dondequiera que vayamos. Así que rezo con San Pablo: "Que la gracia del Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo sean con todos vosotros." En el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo.

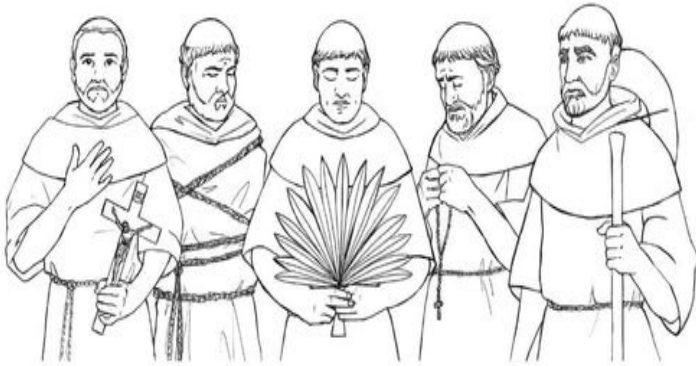

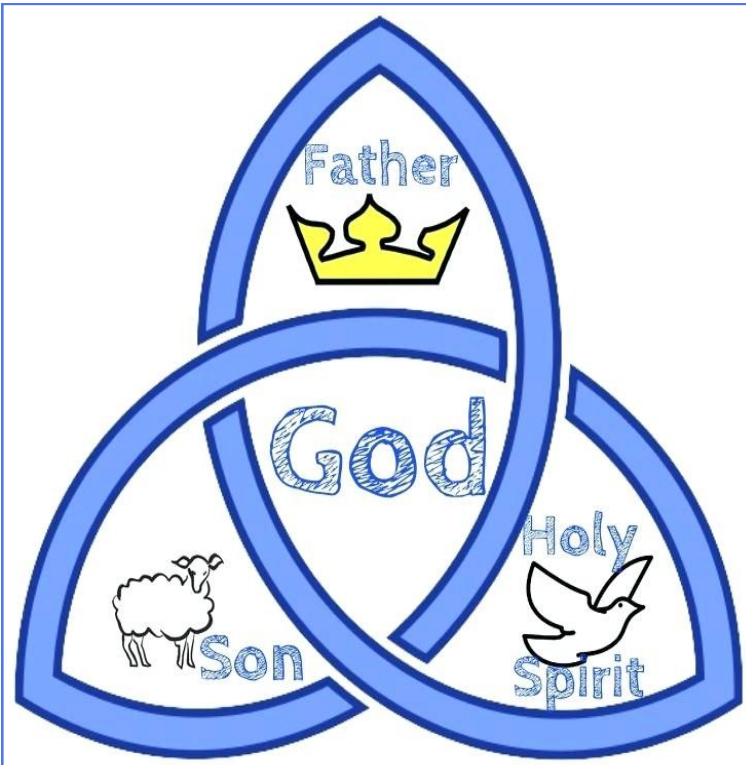

What is the Holy Trinity?

The Holy Trinity means that God is three distinct Persons in one divine being. Each Person of the Trinity has a unique role:

- **God the Father** – He is the Creator of heaven and earth, who loves us with an everlasting love, calling us His beloved children. Through Him, all things were made, and His care for us is unceasing.
- **God the Son (Jesus Christ)** – The Son is the Savior, who took on human flesh to live among us, teach us, and, ultimately, sacrifice Himself for our salvation. Through His life, death, and Resurrection, He has opened the door to eternal life with God.
- **God the Holy Spirit** – The Spirit is the Comforter and the Guide, who empowers and strengthens us, dwelling within our hearts. The Holy Spirit teaches us how to live the Christian life, helps us grow in virtue, and inspires us in our prayer and daily actions.

Even though they are three distinct Persons, they are united in their essence, being fully God. Together, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit reveal the beautiful mystery of God's love and presence in our lives.

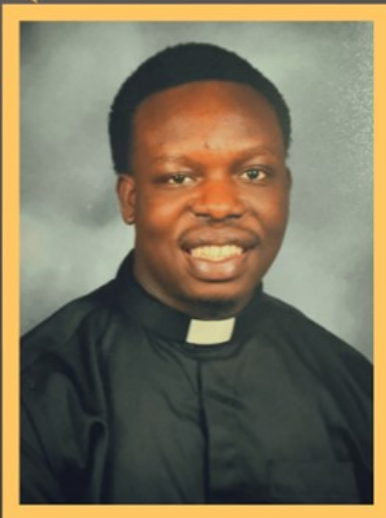
